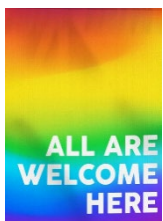

Julian of Norwich *Love is God's meaning*

Julian was a fourteenth century anchoress living in an anchorage attached to St. Julian's Church in Norwich England.

Little is known of the details of Julian's life, not even her birth name, however, we have a great insight into her spiritual beliefs and teachings. When Julian became very ill in her thirtieth year, the crucified Jesus appeared to her and revealed God's divine love in a series of "Shewings". Julian lived for at least a further 40 years and continued her conversations with God to better understand God's mysterious purposes. We will spend time with some of Julian's teachings in silence and reflective sharing.
