Hearth Gatherings: Wisdom from three Dominicans, two Benedictines, and a Beguine – Rhineland Mystics of the 12^{th} to the 14^{th} centuries

What was it about the German Rhineland which bordered France, Switzerland, Belgium and the Netherlands that made it the cradle of a kind of mysticism which still draws those seeking to walk more closely to God? For the Dominicans beginning with Meister Eckhart (1260 – 1326) Cologne became the centre of theological education and both Henry Suso born in Switzerland around 1300 and Johannes Tauler born in Strasbourg in 1300 were students of Eckhart in Cologne.

Mechthild of Magdeburg who was born in German Saxony 50 years before Eckhart was A Dominican Tertiary. Her Dominican confessor encouraged her to compose The Flowing Light. While Hildegarde of Bingen died almost 100 years before Eckhart was born there is scholarly evidence that he was familiar with her writings as well of those of Mechthild. Gertrude Benedictine Abbess of Helfta was a contemporary of Eckhart and it is not too much of a stretch to imagine them corresponding even if they didn't meet. How might their insights be relevant to us over 600 years later?
