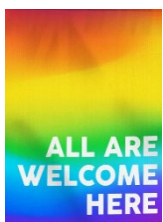

## ***Feast Day Reflections to be held in St. Theodore's Church***

### **Feast Day of Julian of Norwich**

**Sunday 11th May 11.30 am to 12.30pm**

Julian of Norwich lived as an anchoress (contemplative recluse) in the late 14<sup>th</sup> century following a series of 16 revelations or 'showings' from God. She is recognized as the first woman to write a book in the English language. Her feast day is celebrated on the 8<sup>th</sup> of May in the Church of England and the 13<sup>th</sup> of May in the Roman Catholic Church. She is certainly worthy of a week-long commemoration.



### **Evelyn Underhill Feast Day**

**Sunday 15<sup>th</sup> June 11.30am to 12.30 pm**

Evelyn Underhill was born in England in 1875 and studied history and botany at Kings College for Women. She was a great teacher, spiritual director and preacher of retreats including for Anglican clergy.

She is commemorated liturgically in the Anglican and Episcopal Churches on 15 June every year. She is remembered in the Church of England as the person who did more than anyone to help people grasp the priority of prayer and the place of contemplation in it.

There is no charge for these times of prayer. However, if you want to buy the Anglican Prayer Beads, which we will use, a donation of \$5 is suggested.
